

The 2013 Southeastern Critical Care Summit - General Information

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Critical care is one of the most resource-intensive areas in U.S. healthcare and one where the guality of healthcare delivery is known to vary significantly despite substantial medical advances in the past decade. This symposium will provide targeted education for common critical care conditions and procedures to multi-professional healthcare stakeholders. This program uses interactive and case-based lectures from stakeholders at all levels (administration, physicians, mid-level providers as well as nursing and respiratory therapy personnel), as well as hands-on teaching in breakout sessions. Topics of particular importance (i.e. prevalence in critical care) or controversy will involve roundtable discussion with stakeholders and/or breakout sessions; these topics will also be utilized for smallgroup discussions, teaching and procedural education.

At the conclusion of this program, the participant will be able to:

- Describe the most recent evidence based medical care guidelines for managing common critical care conditions:
- Compare and contrast current delivery methods of ICU care with most recent evidence based guidelines; and
- Develop implementation strategies for increasing guality and efficiency in delivering critical care.

This course is intended for critical care physicians, medical directors, nurses and clinical nurse specialists, critical care pharmacists, nurse managers, respiratory therapists, dietitians, rehabilitation specialists and mid-level providers.

Guest Speakers



J. Randall Curtis, MD, MPH is Professor of Medicine and Director of the Palliative Care Center of Excellence at the University of Washington and Section Head of Pulmonary and Critical Care at Harborview Medical Center. Dr. Curtis focuses on improving palliative and end-of-life care for patients as well as patients' families dealing with both critical illnesses and chronic lifelimiting diseases. He has an active research program with over 15 years of continuous funding from the NIH and he has authored more than 170 research articles and more than 100 editorials and chapters. Dr. Curtis has received numerous awards, including the Roger C. Bone Award for Advances in End-of-Life Care from the American College of Chest Physicians.



Albert Farrugia, BSc, PhD is Adjunct Professor, University of Western Australia School of Surgery and Research Fellow, Australian National University College of Medicine, Biology and Environment. Professor Farrugia is a widely recognized authority in blood and plasma therapeutics, having worked with WHO and both the US and European pharmaceutical commissions for blood product safety. He has published more than 120 scholarly articles on blood and plasma products, and has been recognized as a Fellow of the British Institute of Biomedical Sciences and awarded the Ruth Sanger Oration Medal by the Australia and New Zealand Society for Blood Transfusion.



Gilles Fraser, PharmD is a Critical Care Pharmacist at Maine Medical Center and Professor of Medicine at Tufts University School of Medicine. Dr. Gil Fraser is extensively published as an expert on pharmacologic treatment of the critically ill, particularly involving sedation, analgesia and neurocognitive dysfunction. Dr. Fraser has been writing clinical practice guidelines since 1999 and he was a seminal contributor and co-author of the new SCCM guidelines for management of pain, analgesia and delirium.
