Accomplishments, Appointments, Awards

David Wright 2015 has been appointed as the Chair of the Department of Emergency Medicine. He has served as interim department chair since June 2018 and has been a member of our School of Medicine faculty since 1997.

Clint Shedd 2014 received a four-year \$2.2 million grant from the Health Resources and Services Administration to fund a nurse practitioner residency program. Other School of Nursing faculty involved were Elizabeth Downes 2016 and Carolyn Clevenger 2013.

Jada Bussey-Jones 2014 was named Assistant Dean Professional Development for Emory at Grady.

Laura Kimble 2018 received an NIH Supplement Award for her study entitled "Metabolites and Metabolic Pathways Associated with Symptoms Among African Americans with Systemic Lupus Erythematosus and Hypertension".

Jonathan Kaufman 2014 has been named interim director of the Division of Hematology in the department of Hematology and Medical Oncology. The new division combines the old hematology and BMT divisions into one unified division.

The duration of service is 4 years. These committees are in charge of setting the ASCO clinical guidelines focused on the management of different solid tumors including Head and Neck Cancer.

Starting in 2020, Greg Martin 2011 will begin serving as President-Elect of the Society of Critical Care Medicine.

To add to that excitement, Danny and his wife (also an Emory Medical School graduate in 2017) are expecting a baby boy in April.

We have been funded for the Alzheimer's Disease Drug Discovery Center by the NIH (\$37 million over five years). Haian Fu 2015 will serve as a multi-PI. Scott Davis 2017 was nominated to the Board of Governors for the Society of Gastrointestinal and Endoscopic Surgery and is now a member in the Southern Surgical Association.

As of Jan 1st, 2020, Ray Young 2014 will be Chief of Psychiatry at Emory Midtown Hospital.

The inaugural Winship 5K Research Professorship was presented to Larry Boise 2014, Winship multiple myeloma researcher and associate director for education and training, on October 29. The Professorship award is made possible through generous gifts to the Winship 5K and will allow Larry to explore new areas of research that will improve the care of people with cancer.

Effective November 1, Taofeek Owonikoko 2019 assumed the role of co-leader of Winship's Discovery and Developmental Therapeutics (DDT) Research Program. He joins DDT Program Leader Haian Fu 2015 and succeeds Suresh Ramalingam 2017 in serving as this program's co-leader.

Mike Zwick 2016 was appointed Associate Vice President for Research in the Robert W. Woodruff Health Sciences Center and Associate Dean of Research in the Emory University School of Medicine.

Suresh Ramalingam 2017 had two publications in the New England Journal of Medicine in November 2019 with roles as senior author and first author respectively. These papers reported on new immunotherapy and targeted therapy approaches for patients with lung cancer.

Winship investigators, including Carey Jansen, Nataliya Prokhnevska, Hadyn Kissick, and Viraj Master 2014, collaborated with surgeons to look at how the level of T cell infiltration in tumors can predict post-surgery outcomes. The results, which focused on kidney and other urologic cancers but could apply more broadly, were published December 11 in *Nature*.

Drs. Rathi Pillai and Suresh Ramalingam 2017 led an international, Phase III trial of ganetespib, a heat shock protein 90 inhibitor, in combination with docetaxel for second-line therapy of patients with advanced adenocarcinoma of the lung. The results of the study were published Dec. 12 in the *Journal of Clinical Oncology*.

In November, Ted Johnson 2010 was honored for his and Emory's work in support of those aging in the Atlanta Community at the *Thanks a Million* gala.

Congratulations to Meredith Lora, Adedapo Odetoyinbo 2015, and Tammie Quest 2008, the winners of the 2019 Distinguished Service Award.

Dimitri Cassimatis 2018 and Richard Pittman 2015 received the 2019 Dean's Teaching Award. Recipients are nominated by colleagues and students and chosen by the Teaching Awards Committee for their dedication to medical student teaching and their many contributions as course directors and mentors.

Justin Remais 2014 launched a major new research initiative at the University of California, Berkeley, investigating the epidemiology and environmental biology of *Coccidioides immitis* in California, supported by an R01 from NIH-NIAID. Justin joined the Berkeley faculty in 2016 after serving on the faculty in the Rollins School of Public Health for seven years. He continues to hold an adjunct faculty position at Rollins.


HAPPY TRAILS
