Annette Esper 2020, Steve Goudy 2020, and Nadine Rouphael 2017 are School of Medicine researchers whose work was highlighted as part of this year's Researcher Appreciation Day. The SOM Faculty Recognitions Committee organizes this opportunity every year for faculty to nominate colleagues who are making scientific advances that improve lives.

Jamlik-Omari Johnson 2016 was appointed as Vice Chair for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, Department of Radiology and Imaging Science.

Maha Lund 2018 is excited and humbled to have been elected At-Large-Commissioner for the Accreditation Review Commission on Education for the Physician Assistant (ARC-PA), the organization that accredits Physician Assistant programs in the US. The Commission is comprised of 22 Commissioners who evaluate the reports provided by site visitors and make decisions on programs' accreditation status. Commissioners also participate in site visits, especially to programs with provisional accreditation or programs on probation.

Emory, GSU supporting 187 Georgia Nursing Homes COVID-19 Response via Telemedicine

The goals of the NNHCAN project are to mitigate the impact of COVID-19 on long-term care communities and to stop the spread of SARS-COV-2. "Through the targeted training of nursing home personnel - who can then select, implement, and evaluate best practices to respond to this public health issue - we hope to see significant reductions in the spread of SARS-COV-2," said Dr. Ted Johnson, Professor and Director of Georgia's Geriatric Workforce Enhancement Program.

Winship virtual Grand Rounds continued on Dec. 9 with Lisa Bernstein 2010 presenting "Providing Feedback: Coach Not Critic."

Epidemiology faculty and trainees from Emory's Rollins School of Public Health led sessions and presented research at the Society for Epidemiological Research (SER) Annual Meeting, that took place virtually Dec. 16-18. Tim Lash 2018 was among the conference faculty.

Ned Waller 2007 shared: "A new activity for me is running a randomized placebo controlled clinical trial of duvelisib, a PI3 kinase inhibitor in patients with severe COVID-19. I wrote the study and hold the IND from the FDA. This study is repurposing a cancer drug with immuno modularity properties to treat COVID-19 patients. We have consented 19 out of a planned 80 subjects to-date, and have not seen any toxicities, with all treated patients leaving the hospital. Seeing COVID-19 patients first hand has given me an appreciation of the severity of this disease, and the lack of understanding of its pathophysiology. Why do some patients get so sick while other breeze through their infection? I hope that our study can shed some light on this important question and help keep Emory patients from needing to be intubated."



In January 2021, she will assume the position of Chief Scientific Officer with the Georgia Center for Oncology, Research and Education (CORE), an organization that brings together individuals and organizations across local hospitals, community and academic programs to positively impact the lives of cancer patients throughout the state of Georgia.
