

EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP FELLOWSHIP

A 12-month program for health sciences educators who want to advance their educational leadership skills. The fellowship includes leadership development through monthly skills development workshops or interprofessional panel discussions, co-directorship duties in one of the WHEA programs, and will culminate in a capstone project. Fellows will receive 5% salary support and professional development funds.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

After completing the WHEA Educational Leadership Fellowship, participants will be able to:

- Demonstrate leadership skills applicable to diverse educational contexts.
- Apply key principles and theories of leadership and change management to educational initiatives.
- Lead the implementation of educational initiatives within their professional settings.

WHO SHOULD APPLY

This fellowship is ideal for experienced educators from any of the Woodruff Health Sciences Center schools, centers, programs, or practice sites who are dedicated to and passionate about developing their leadership skills and leading education initiatives. Support of administrative unit required.

Up to two (2) fellows will be selected each year based on a competitive application process, including completed application, personal statement, letter of support, and interviews.
